

Dear Customer,

Re: M69 northbound over M6 junction 2 essential maintenance

We wrote to you on 1st December 2023 regarding our upcoming work on the M69 northbound which included the re-waterproofing of the bridge, resurfacing, road markings and the replacing of bridge joints.

When will this work take place?

Our work will start on 8 January 2024, and we expect to complete by the end of May 2024 and we'll be working throughout the day from 8am to 5pm apart from the below circumstances.

While most of our work will be carried out under lane closures and 24/7 narrow lanes, there will be times when we need to close the road and diversions will be in place. During these closures we'll be working from 10pm to 6am.

To maintain safety, we'll install a reduced speed limit along with speed enforcement which has been designed to protect both our workforce on site and road users.

What does this mean for you?

Please see below for a detailed breakdown of the dates and times regarding full carriageway closures and diversions. Please plan ahead and allow additional time for your journey.

Access for emergency service vehicles will be maintained throughout.

We'll make every effort to ensure the impact on the local community and travelling public is kept to a minimum. We always aim to work to the programme, however unforeseen circumstances or adverse weather conditions may mean changes.
